"THE GREAT EXCHANGE"

Believe it or not, that is a term or phrase that theologians us in their conversing with one another. You might wonder, just what does that mean. We common folk, might think of it as"swapping" or "trading." We do it all the time. Folks may do favors for each other. Others may trade items of property. The goal usually is that each person receives something of equal value to what was traded. In other words, everyone comes out "even-Steven." No one is gaining an advantage over the other.

We know that it does not always work that way. Most people will try to work things to their advantage in any swap or trade. That is what is happening in "The Great Exchange." It is the story of Jesus Christ and all that He has done for each of us. He took our sin and gave us His righteousness.

Really, that is the story of all we do in the Christian Church; everything we preach and teach; our celebration of baptism and the Lord's Supper. "The Great Exchange" is the very center and focus of our faith. We will very soon begin the Lenten Season. Lent is indeed an interesting time of the Church Year.

Quite often people will get wrapped up in "What are you doing for Lent?" Seemingly, doing something will make you a better person or make you more worthy of salvation. Such thoughts couldn't be farther from the truth. If you do something for Lent, it ought to be something which draws you closer to "The Great Exchange."

We are helpless, hopeless, even damnable people. Our sin has totally ruined us. We are lost and condemned. There is no way we could participate in a swap or trade to benefit our soul. That is what makes "The Great Exchange" so great. Christ, in His total perfection took our total imperfection in trade; as a swap; as an exchange. We who are unrighteous are made righteous. This exchange is unequal and certainly not fair. Yet Christ did it for us.

We certainly got the best end of this deal. We came out ahead; far ahead. That is what we will proclaim once again this Lenten Season. Come to Sunday and Mid-Week services this Lent. Devote extra time to prayer, meditation, and Scripture reading. Take a long, hard look at the work of Christ. See what He has done. "The Great Exchange" has been made and it was made for you.

It is a very slow, painstaking work. The Millers will be continuing their work in 2016 as they return to South East Asia, going this time in Communist Laos.
