Dear Friends in Christ:

At the end of October, we are getting ready for something big, really BIG! It is the 500th anniversary of the Reformation which takes place a year from now, on October 31, 2017.

You might think, can this really be that big? Well, yes it is? We celebrate anniversaries of things all the time, weddings, birthdays, personal accomplishments, and we even remember personal losses, such as a death in the family. On a larger scale our nation celebrates historical events, such as Independence Day and Pearl Harbor Day. This however is larger yet. People on every continent will be celebrating the Reformation. We have been promised that there will even be television specials in about a year focusing on the events of the Reformation.

Some may think, why bother celebrating. Isn't the Reformation nothing more than Martin Luther nailing something to a church door? It may seem that way. Luther was an obscure German monk who had a number of thoughts floating through his mind (95 to be exact). He formulated them into theses and posted them on the castle church door in Wittenberg, Germany for everyone to see. It seems such a simple thing, but it set off a firestorm.

Luther's act was the beginning of a sea change in the course of history of the world. The Reformation brought about the beginning of the Lutheran Church and opened the door for all sorts of other Protestant churches. It brought about enormous changes in the way schools and colleges educate students. It brought about the whole printing and publishing business utilizing a piece of new technology called the printing press. Through the Reformation, common, ordinary people could read, learn and understand the Bible. The Reformation has touched every man, woman, and child who has lived in the last 500 years.

At the turn of the millennium Life magazine ranked the Reformation right behind the discovery of America as the second most influential event of the last 1000 years. It also ranked Luther as the third most important historical figure behind Edison and Columbus.

While all these things are big, really BIG, we cannot forget the greatest aspect of the Reformation. That is that you and I and everyone in the world has access to the Gospel message of salvation in and through our Lord Jesus Christ. Having the Gospel message is BIG, In fact it is bigger than BIG!

Beginning on October 30 when we observe Reformation Sunday, we will begin a year-long celebration of what is that God has accomplished for us through the hard work and devotion of Martin Luther and many others who assisted him in bringing about these changes in the world and especially in bringing us the Gospel. REFORMATION SERVICE

On Sunday, October 30, we will observe the 499th Anniversary of the Lutheran Reformation in our worship service.

The Reformation encompasses a whole series of events which led to the formation the Lutheran Church and Protestantism in general, It began with the nailing of the 95 theses on the castle church door on October 31, 1517 by Martin Luther. In fact, we will not just observe it that one Sunday, we are beginning a year-long celebration of the Reformation that will continue until October 29, 2017 when we will observe the 500th anniversary. This will be a year in which we focus on all the events which make up this unique period of history

Following the 9:45 a.m. worship service there will be a Reformation pot-luck dinner served in the church fellowship hall. Come to celebrate something special. After all, how often do we have a 500th anniversary?

Searching SCRIPTURE

Four 'Alones'

Sola is the Latin word for "alone." For the Reformers, four solas rang through Sacred Scripture: grace alone, faith alone, Scripture alone, Christ alone. With the help of the Hymn of the Day for Reformation, "Salvation unto Us Has Come" (LSB 555), let's examine what Scripture says about each sola. If a Lutheran Service Book is available, sing or recite stanza 1 of "Salvation unto Us Has Come." (LSB will enhance this study, but you can proceed without it.)

Salvation unito us has come By God's free grace and favor; Good works cannot avert our doom, They help and save us never Faith looks to Jesus Christ alone, Who did for all the world atone; He is our one Redeemer.

Grace Alone!

Read Eph. 2:4-10. How did God show His great love for us? What was OUR condition when this love was given us? Cf. Rom. 5:8.____

What did God do for us in Christ? (For another way of describing this, see 2 Cor. 5:19.)

Discuss: Why did God do this? What does "by grace" mean? Do good works come before, or follow after, grace?

Now sing or recite stanza 6 of LSB 555.

Faith Alone!

Read Rom. 3:19-28. What does the Law do to all people? Is it possible for anyone to be justified by "works of the Law"? Why? Cf. Matt. 5:48.

How did God "manifest" His righteousness apart from Law? Why is there no distinction?

Discuss: What did God set our Lord Jesus before us as? How is He to be received? How is God "just" and the "justifier of the one who has faith in Jesus"?

What does St. Paul conclude about justification? What does "apart from works of the Law" end up excluding?

Sing or recite stanza 9.

Scripture Alone!

Read John 8:31-36. What did our Lord say to the Jews who had believed in Him?____

How do we do that? Cf. Col. 3:16.____ What does His Word teach us? Cf. Jesus?

prayer in John 17:17.

What does the Word teach us about our bondage to sin? Cf. Ps. 51:5; Eph. 2:1-3.____

Discuss: What does the Word teach us about the freedom we have in Christ? How does the Son set us free? Cf. Eph. 1:13, 14; Col. 2:13, 14. Sing or recite stanza 7.

Christ Alone!

Read Acts 4:1-12. Why were the apostles in jail, and what did the officials want to know from them? How did St. Peter answer their question?____

Discuss: What does St. Peter proclaim about Jesus? Why is there salvation in no other name? Cf. John 14:6. What is the unique gift that comes only through Jesus' name? Cf. Acts 12:43.

Sing or recite stanza 8.

Sola, then: grace, faith, Scripture, and all because there's only one Lord Jesus in whom we can be saved! On Reformation Day, we thank God for bringing such joyful truths to light again through the work of Martin Luther and the other reformers. A blessed Reformation festival to all!




+ Verne C. Graves +
