

YOUR NEW YEAR'S RESOLUTION

It's hard to believe. The New Year is almost upon us. No, I'm not talking of the change when we flip the calendars to 2017. That New Year is definitely fast approaching. I am speaking about the New Year which begins in a little over a week, as I write these words.

It's the New Year of the Liturgical Calendar. Each year, we begin a new Liturgical Calendar on the fourth Sunday before Christmas. That Sunday is the First Sunday of Advent. This year, it falls on November 27. Just as the changing of the secular calendar encourages us to evaluate our personal life; so does the Liturgical Calendar.

If we each evaluate our personal faith life, we no doubt would find areas in which we need improvement. The Lord never intended that our faith would become static, never growing, never advancing. He intended that our faith would always grow stronger and deeper. I am sure that if any of us were to say that our faith is just fine as it is, we would be greatly deceiving ourselves. At the beginning of this New Liturgical Year, I am encouraging each of us to make a New Year's Resolution. Here are some possibilities for you to consider.

More Faithful Church Attendance – Hebrews 10:25 says we ought not neglect the coming together to worship. Can you increase the number of Sundays you come to worship? Can you start coming to the various mid-week services?

Regular Bible Reading – Psalm 119:105 tells us that God's Word is a lamp to our feet. Try reading a chapter each day. Come to a Bible Class. Try memorizing a few familiar passages.

Develop the habit of Prayer – Philippians 4:6 encourages us to make all our requests be known to God by prayer and supplications. Why not set aside another five or ten minutes each day for a little more quiet time talking with The Lord.

Be of service to others – In Matthew 22:39, Jesus tells us that next to loving the Lord with all one's heart, soul, and mind, loving one's neighbor is the second greatest commandment. Are there acts of love and kindness you can be doing for others in the name of The Lord?


Tell others about the love of Jesus – When Jesus told His disciples, in Acts 1:8 that they were to be His witnesses to the ends of the earth, He meant that for us as well. Why not make a determination that you will tell a family member or friend about Jesus? Why not be willing to bring Jesus up in any conversation with anyone?

Help out around the Church – Remember Simeon and Anna, two folks we meet in Luke Chapter 2. They devoted huge amounts of time to doing things in the temple. Perhaps, you could spend a few hours doing some of the various tasks that need to be done around church. Perhaps you could take on a special activity you are interested in. There are many possibilities.

Increase your Support of the Church – In 2 Corinthians 9:7, St. Paul explains that The Lord loves a cheerful giver. Of course, when people hear that, they automatically think of money. Yes, The Lord wants us to cheerfully support His work with financial gifts and offerings. Yes, we could all most likely increase our support in that area. There is however, the support we give of our time, our interest, and most certainly our prayers for our church, people, and pastor. How do these things sound? Can you make a few New Year's resolutions for the new Liturgical Year? God bless and strengthen you as you do to His honor and glory.


One of my favorite parts of Christmas is sitting with my family telling and retelling our Christmas memories, like. . .
