

# Martin Luther The Idea That Changed the World


A new feature length movie entitled, Martin Luther – The Idea That Changed The World, has been released in very limited private screenings in honor of the 500<sup>th</sup> anniversary of The Reformation. Major funding for the movie has come from Thrivent Financial for Lutherans. The movie shows only in public theaters under contract with local congregations.

Our sister, circuit congregation, St. Paul Lutheran in Chicago Heights is sponsoring a showing of the movie on a one-time basis, Thursday, April 27, 2017, 7:30 to 9:43 p.m. at the Marcus Theaters, 1301 Hilltop Ave, Chicago Heights. This is a onetime only showing. It Is also the only showing in our local vicinity.

The movie has been shown in other locations around the country since February on a very limited basis, with tickets being sold out each time. It is expected that this showing will be a sell-out as well For that reason, tickets must be bought early in advance.

## FLY THE FLAGS

## CIRCUIT RE-ALIGNMENT

Did you know that there are 218 congregations that make up the Northern Illinois District of the Lutheran Church – Missouri Synod? St. Paul is one of them. These congregations are then grouped together in local configurations to jointly accomplish mission work in their immediate area. Constitutionally, a circuit must have a minimum of seven congregations. Frequently things happen which alter the makeup of circuits throughout the district. That has happened in the Northern Illinois District. Hence there has just been completed a massive circuit realignment. Our present circuit of six congregations has been split apart. Effective June 1, 2018, we will be part of a new Circuit # 19. The congregations which will form this circuit are:
