#### A Man Called Martin



Two years ago, the Lutheran Laymen's League undertook an ambitious project of producing an in depth look at the Lutheran Reformation through the efforts of Martin Luther in celebration

of the Reformation's 500th anniversary. This project culminated in the production of a three part video series entitled "A Man Called Martin."

Its three parts are spread out over three years on the life of Martin Luther and the significance of The Reformation, During the previous two years,



at St. Paul, we have shown the first two parts. This year we are showing the third part focusing on the movement of The Reformation through the centuries to the present time. The third part is subdivided into five segments, which we will be showing through October, beginning Sunday, October 1at 9:00 a.m. during the Sunday School, Bible Class time in the church fellowship hall on the big screen monitor.

Many of the things Luther advocated not only benefit us in the church today, but also in our lives in today's world. ### It's Still All About Jesus!

Dear Friends in Christ:

It is turning out that at St. Paul, we are not just celebrating Reformation Day this year. Rather we seem to be celebrating Reformation month this October. Normally we take just one day to remember that Martin Luther on October 31, 1517 nailed his 95 theses to the castle church door in Wittenberg, Germany. Though that event seemed rather insignificant; it turned out that that event had many ramifications that changed the course of world history. We still today feel the impact of Luther's hammer and nails.

This year marks 500 years from the time Luther nailed his 95 theses. He only wanted to make simple suggestions to better the work and ministry of the church of his day. Little did he realize what he was doing would set off a multitude of other events culminating in millions of people today calling themselves "Lutherans."

At St. Paul we have a number of things planned to celebrate 500 years. Each Sunday in October an activity is planned and we will focus on a different aspect of the Reformation. Yes, there will be much talk about Luther and others who played an important role in the Reformation. We will be doing things to emphasize our history and heritage as Lutherans. Within all of this will be a clear message that our real treasure is not Martin Luther and other characters and events

in the Reformation. Rather our real cause for celebration and joy is JESUS!

It's Still All About Jesus! That's the theme chosen by our church body, The Lutheran Church – Missouri Synod to celebrate the Reformation's 500th. That theme directs it to what it's all about. While the Reformation accomplished the task of clarifying the Gospel and enabled the church to proclaim it loud and clear; the Reformation will never save any of our sin-sick souls from eternal destruction in the pit of hell. Martin Luther and all the others in Reformation history needed salvation, just as you and I do. They needed Jesus. We need Jesus.

It's Still All About Jesus! The Father in heaven sent Jesus into this world to accomplish what we could not do. By His birth, life, obedience, suffering, death, burial, resurrection, and ascension Christ paid the price of salvation for each of us. What can we do? Nothing! Absolutely Nothing! Jesus did it all. Our salvation is full and complete.

Martin Luther made the message clear for the people of his day. Hopefully and prayerfully, the message is clear to us today. It's Still All About Jesus!
