



The Reproaches of Christ From the Cross

P Although we are centuries removed from the events of Christ's crucifixion and even further removed from the miraculous Exodus of Israel from Egyptian bondage, we, like the Israelites before, have not always received God's abundant grace in humble obedience and with proper gratitude. 




- you with living water, and you have given Me gall and vinegar to drink, O My people. Jeremiah 2:6-7

Luke 23:33-49

P The Holy Gospel according to St. Luke, the twenty-third chapter.

G Glory to You O Lord.

³³And when they came to the place that is called The Skull, there they crucified him, and the criminals, one on his right and one on his left. ³⁴And Jesus said, "Father, forgive them, for they know not what they do." And they cast lots to divide his garments. ³⁵And the people stood by, watching, but the rulers scoffed at him, saying, "He saved others; let him save himself, if he is the Christ of God, his Chosen One!" ³⁶The soldiers also mocked him, coming up and offering him sour wine ³⁷and saying, "If you are the King of the Jews, save yourself!" ³⁸There was also an inscription over him, "This is the King of the Jews."

³⁹One of the criminals who were hanged railed at him, saying, "Are you not the Christ? Save yourself and us!" ⁴⁰But the other rebuked him, saying, "Do you not fear God, since you are under the same sentence of condemnation? ⁴¹And we indeed justly, for we are receiving the due reward of our deeds; but this man has done nothing wrong." ⁴²And he said, "Jesus, remember me when you come into your kingdom." ⁴³And he said to him, "Truly, I say to you, today you will be with me in Paradise."

⁴⁴It was now about the sixth hour, and there was darkness over the whole land until the ninth hour, ⁴⁵while the sun's light failed. And the curtain of the temple was torn in two. ⁴⁶Then Jesus, calling out with a loud voice, said, "Father, into your hands I commit my spirit!" And having said this he breathed his last. ⁴⁷Now when the centurion saw what had taken place, he praised God, saying, "Certainly this man was innocent!" ⁴⁸And all the crowds that had assembled for this spectacle, when they saw what had taken place, returned home beating their breasts. ⁴⁹And all his acquaintances and the women who had followed him from Galilee stood at a distance watching these things.



The Exit of the Christ Candle and Processional Cross

The eternal light, which burns constantly, remains in the sanctuary. Although the Paschal candle has been removed representing the death of Christ, the eternal light remains representing Christ's divine, eternal nature which did not die and which remained alive while He was in the tomb.

All are asked to leave this service in total quiet and silence, with all solemnity in keeping with the mood of Good Friday. No Benediction is given, in keeping with the thought that the Good Friday Service is a continuation of The Maundy Thursday Service and continues unto the close of The Easter Sunrise Service.
