




Confession and Absolution

- Lent. A sad and bleak season of the Church year; a time for confession and renewal.
- We know we're supposed to examine our lives and confess our sins; we may even want to give something up as we follow Christ to the cross.
- P As we begin our Lenten worship this evening, we continue our voyage with Jonah.
- He is the one who heard God's command and went the other way.
- P He is the one who begrudged God for giving his grace to others.
- **C** He is the one who was caught in a storm and thrown overboard.
- P He is the one who was sure that he could get away from God and avoid his responsibility.
- But let us also examine our own lives and see how we run from God's call in our lives. Forgive me, O Lord, when I doubt that you actually love the world. Forgive me when I make excuses to avoid making any commitment to you. Forgive me when I run away from you and doubt that you really care about me. Forgive me when I disobey your commandments, and I am satisfied with living in my sin.
- As Jonah ran away, we often run away from you, Father, because we are sure that we have a better plan for our life which selfishly does not include others. As we consider your gracious plan for salvation in Jesus Christ, we look to you for forgiveness of our sins and for your renewal. Forgive us, Heavenly Father.
- P Upon this your confession to God our Father who knows our going out and our lying down and who is familiar with all our ways, as a called and ordained servant of Christ, I forgive you all your sins in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. Amen.

Psalm 139, selected verses

- P O LORD, you have searched me and you know me.
- You know when I sit and when I rise; you perceive my thoughts from afar.
- P You discern my going out and my lying down; you are familiar with all my wavs.
- Before a word is on my tongue, you know it completely, O LORD. You hem me in behind and before; you have laid your hand upon me.
- P Such knowledge is too wonderful for me, too lofty for me to attain.
- Where can I go from your Spirit? Where can I flee from your presence?

- If I go up to the heavens, you are there; if I make my bed in the depths, you are there.
- If I rise on the wings of the dawn, if I settle on the far side of the sea, even there your hand will guide me, your right hand will hold me fast.
- P For you created my inmost being; you knit me together in my mother's womb. I praise you because I am fearfully and wonderfully made; your works are wonderful. I know that full well.
- Glory be to the Father and to the Son and to the Holy Spirit. As it was in the beginning, is now, and ever shall be, world without end. Amen.

Old Testament Reading

Jonah 1:4-16

A The Old Testament Reading for This Wednesday in Lent is from the first chapter of Jonah.

Jonah 1:4-16

But the LORD hurled a great wind upon the sea, and there was a mighty tempest on the sea, so that the ship threatened to break up. Then the mariners were afraid, and each cried out to his god. And they hurled the cargo that was in the ship into the sea to lighten it for them. But Jonah had gone down into the inner part of the ship and had lain down and was fast asleep. So the captain came and said to him, "What do you mean, you sleeper? Arise, call out to your god! Perhaps the god will give a thought to us, that we may not perish."

And they said to one another, "Come, let us cast lots, that we may know on whose account this evil has come upon us." So they cast lots, and the lot fell on Jonah. Then they said to him, "Tell us on whose account this evil has come upon us. What is your occupation? And where do you come from? What is your country? And of what people are you?" And he said to them, "I am a Hebrew, and I fear the LORD, the God of heaven, who made the sea and the dry land." Then the men were exceedingly afraid and said to him, "What is this that you have done!" For the men knew that he was fleeing from the presence of the LORD, because he had told them.

Then they said to him, "What shall we do to you, that the sea may quiet down for us?" For the sea grew more and more tempestuous. He said to them, "Pick me up and hurl me into the sea; then the sea will quiet down for you, for I know it is because of me that this great tempest has come upon you." Nevertheless, the men rowed hard to get back to dry land, but they could not, for the sea grew more and more tempestuous against them. Therefore they called out to

the LORD, "O LORD, let us not perish for this man's life, and lay not on us innocent blood, for you, O LORD, have done as it pleased you." So they picked up Jonah and hurled him into the sea, and the sea ceased from its raging. Then the men feared the LORD exceedingly, and they offered a sacrifice to the LORD and made yows.

Then he rose and rebuked the winds and the sea, and there was a great calm. ²⁷And the men marveled, saying, "What sort of man is this, that even winds and sea obey him?"

- Praise to You, O Christ.

- P Shall we fear the storms of family life? "The children of your servants will live in your presence; their descendants will be established before you." Lord In Your mercy

- P Shall we fear the storm of death? "Even though I walk through the valley of the shadow of death, I will fear no evil, for you are with me; your rod and your staff they comfort me." Lord In Your mercy
- **G** Hear our prayer.
- P Heavenly Father, Your Son has shown Your love to the world in His death and resurrection. Give Your people hearts to remember Your gracious works and to proclaim Your name in all things and to all people. Lord, in Your mercy,
- **G** Hear our prayer.
- P Lord God, heavenly Father, You promise us an inheritance not because of Your law but because of Your promise to the Old Testament Prophets, such as Abraham and Jonah and to us. When you call us, give us your strength to answer. In Your grace, nourish us in the faith unto life eternal. Lord, in Your mercy,
- **C** Hear our prayer.

- P Heavenly Father, as Jonah was thrown into the sea and remained in the belly of the fish for three days and three nights, so your Son spent three days in the heart of the earth and rose to life. Your perfect loves casts out our fear. We will not be afraid, but find confidence in you. "The LORD is my light and my salvation, whom shall I fear? The LORD is the stronghold of my life, of whom shall I be afraid?" Amen.
- P Hear us as we pray in His name of Him who has taught us to pray:
